
Where's Watson? At Encanto School!

For starters, all Montessori environments are multi-age classrooms, with students ranging from 5-8 years old in Ms. Katrina's classroom. This also means their academic interests and areas of the curriculum they are studying may be different as well. This allowed for a

small group of students engaged in similar learning goals to plan a trip where they can extend their learning. That is what happened two weeks ago as a small group of students planned and went on their first "going out" adventure of the year to the Desert Botanical Garden. Osborn has definite plans to expand Montessori offerings next year to a second Primary (preschool-kindergarten) classroom, is accepting enrollment gauging interest in starting a second elementary either next year or the following year, is sponsoring a few teachers in becoming Montessori certified, and is exploring family interest and engagement toward offering Montessori in a dual language setting. 21st Century Film Club at Solano Produces Promo Video







OSDEF Looking for Nominations for TOY 2023

Who will be the next Osborn teacher to be recognized as a Teacher of the Year by the **Osborn School District Educational Foundation** in 2023? Nominations are open now through March 31. Those nominated will then apply for consideration and the Foundation will look to name the newest recipients before the school year ends. Be on the lookout for a "Save the Date" after the next cohort of Teachers of the Year are announced for the annual celebration and fundraiser to take place in October 2023. The criteria for nomination states the teacher must:

- Spend the majority of their teaching assignment in direct and indirect instruction to students
- Teach any grades or combination thereof in Pre-K-8th grade in any content area including arts, PE, special education, master teachers, etc.
- Have completed at least four (4) full years as a teacher in Osborn.
- Be a full-time teacher with intent to actively teach in Osborn for the 23-24 school year
- Not have been selected as an OSDEF Teacher of the Year in the past

Phoenix Coding Academy, and Bioscience High School are small specialty programs that seek highly academically motivated students to pursue computer science pathways, biomedicine, and engineering. Besides visiting the campuses, Osborn also has former students come to talk to our current 8th graders about their experiences.
