Osborn Middle School Student Dress Code Policy 2022-2023

TOPS

Allowed:

- T-shirts, polo shirts, long sleeved shirts, button up shirts, sweaters, jackets and hooded sweatshirts
- School appropriate logos may be on shirts

Tops <u>must have sleeves</u> and cover the <u>torso, stomach, back, and</u> sides at all times.

Not Allowed:

- Tank tops, cut off t-shirts, crop tops, and half shirts
- Shirts that expose the midsection, have low-cut necklines and/or are made of see-through material
- Shirts that promote violence, include hate speech, profanity, or inappropriate/illegal images
- Rips, tears, and/or holes in shirts

PANTS

Allowed:

- Long pants, shorts, capri-style pants, overalls, and skirts
- Jeans, athletic shorts, leggings, and sweatpants

Shorts must be appropriate length to

not expose buttocks or undergarments.

All pants must remain at the waist.

Not Allowed:

- Lace pantyhose and fishnet stockings
- Visible or exposed undergarments

SHOES

Allowed:

- Sneakers
- Sandals (must be closed-toed with a heel strap)

Not Allowed:

- Slippers
- Flip-flops
- High heels

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Allowed:

 Hats and other head coverings that allow the face to be visible

Not Allowed:

- Hats and other head coverings that **do not** allow the face to be visible
- Any item that presents a safety risk, can be used as a weapon, infers gang affiliation, promotes illegal actions, or is inappropriate in any way
- Clothing and accessories that depict violence, hatred, obscene material, alcohol, and/or drugs

Disclaimer:

If students are not following the dress code, they will be given an opportunity to borrow the appropriate clothes from the school or will call home for parents to bring appropriate clothes for them to change into. In order to minimize loss of class time, please ensure that your child is in compliance with the dress code.

All other aspects of the OMS dress code are under the discretion and judgment of the school staff. Adverse behavior by individuals wearing similarly identified items will be addressed by administration. This policy may be subject to change pending administrative action.
