Osborn Seeks \$100 Million Bond and Continuation of Capital Override

This November, community members within the **Osborn School District** boundaries will be asked to vote on a Bond initiative of \$100 million and the continuation Osborn School District's District Additional Assistance (Capital) Override. The funds from the DAA Override make sure teachers have the technology and curriculum supports needed for high quality teaching and learning. It is a continuation of the DAA Override passed in 2017. Since this is a continuation event, there is no tax increase for the DAA override. Bond funding will be used for the construction of a



performance / auditorium facility, facilities and grounds improvements, classroom modernization projects, and an energy efficient (EV) bus fleet. The state funding formulas are inadequate to keep up with the district's capital needs. Without these bond and override funds, the district will not be able to maintain and upkeep facilities as well as provide for the future of the school facilities in the way the community has come to expect.
